Why is there a need for traffic safety education? - CNET ORM training



1. In 1999:

A) An estimated 41,345 people lost their lives in traffic accidents.

B) There were an estimated 15,794 fatalities associated with alcohol.

C) The risk of a crash involvement per mile driven among drivers 16-19 years old is 4 times the risk among older drivers.

D) 4,695 pedestrians were killed in the United States.

Maturity plays a major role in driving habits. Among younger drivers, there is a greater “need for speed.”

OPNAVINST 5100.12G requires that all military members under the age of 26 attend the Chief of Naval Education and Training (CNET) 4-Hour Driver ORM Class. New accessions receive this training during recruit training. Members currently serving who have not received the training must have it provided by their current command. This training must also be documented on a page 13 in each individual’s military service record.

The NAF Atsugi Training Office (DSN 264-3266) has copies of the class curriculum available for check out. There is no special qualifications or certifications required in order to present the class.
